Is Space Tourism a Good Thing?

Many dream of becoming an astronaut because they want to **travel** to space.

Nowadays, you do not need to undergo years of training to do that; you only need to have the money. In 2001, a US multi-millionaire, Dennis Tito, orbited the Earth and
5 spent eight days in space, which marked the beginning of space tourism. Tito said that it had been a wonderful experience, but it was said that he had paid US\$20 million for his trip. In the following eight years, a total of six more tourists made their own space flights.

Although space tourism is the ultimate dream of many, some people wondered whether such a potentially **perilous** journey was worth the risk.

10 Sending humans into space is always a dangerous endeavor. On 31 October 2014, a spaceship crashed in the Mojave Desert during a test flight, killing one pilot and seriously injuring another. It is believed that the spaceship's device was not well developed. Apart from horrible accidents, there is lack of **fresh** air and a suitable living environment which may affect one's physical and mental health. People are not able to predict how their bodies will **react** in different environmental conditions.

15 Some think that **we** may eventually find another planet where humans can live. This will certainly be of great help since the natural resources on Earth are getting **consumed** quickly and the planet may soon become unlivable, as a result of either destructive human activities or natural disasters. This may sound like science fiction, but the threat is real because we really do not know very much about the universe. We ought to be more cautious about our endeavors in space.

20 Although space companies claim that sending tourists into space does not negatively impact the environment, scientists studying climate change do not agree. Particles emitted by rockets could actually remain in the Earth's atmosphere for years. Scientists believe that in the end, the substances from spacecrafts will contribute to atmospheric heating at a higher rate than carbon dioxide production.

Space tourism is not without its merits, but at present, it seems more for the purpose of satisfying
25 the rich's craving for the thrills rather than for the greater good of humanity. A space tourist, Guy Laliberte, paid US\$30 million for his trip to space in 2009 while a ride on Virgin Galactic's spaceship for a few minutes in spaces is estimated to cost US\$250,000. Some say that the cost of space travel will go down over time and our great grandchildren in the future will travel into space for their holidays, but for now, space travel remains an expensive and risky business.
